

## Cheerleading Scholarship Process

Cheerleaders who meet all criteria are eligible for a maximum of three credit hours of in-state tuition during the Fall and Spring terms. No scholarships are available during any other academic term.

### Procedure:

Scholarships are applied at the end of the Fall and Spring Terms, in the form of tuition reimbursements. The Dean of Student Activities and/or Advisor will inform each cheerleader no later than the week prior to finals of his or her scholarship status.

Cheerleaders are responsible for meeting tuition payment deadlines, from other funding sources, at the beginning of each term. Scholarship amounts cannot exceed the number of credit hours for which a student is enrolled.

### Other important information about the cheerleading scholarship process:

- The scholarship covers in-state tuition only.
- Books are not covered by the scholarship.
- Lodging and meals are not covered by the scholarship.
- All scholarship recipients must submit a completed **Free Application for Federal Student Aid (FAFSA)** no later than the September 30 Fall term in order to qualify for the scholarship.
- Students who are appointed to the team after the September meeting of the Fall term may not be eligible for the scholarship.
- The scholarship may affect a student's financial aid package.
- Cheerleaders who do not complete the season will lose eligibility for the scholarship. The season begins on the first official practice and ends the day following the last intercollegiate basketball game or last meeting set by Advisor or Coach.
